

## Pupil Premium Statement

The Pupil Premium is funding in addition to the school's budget. Schools are free to decide how to allocate this funding to best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils. In 2012/13 the school received £4,984 in Pupil Premium allocations.

In 2012/13 the pupil premium was used in a variety of ways. These included:

- Additional TA support to deliver personalised intervention programmes and to reduce adult: pupil ratio
- Additional resources such as a wider range of reading books for the lower ability readers to meet pupil needs and more sports equipment to use during break times and dinner times

Examples of impact in 2012/13 include:

- Identified pupils made at least expected progress with some exceeding their school targets
- A wider range of opportunities to do at breaktimes

The school plans to continue with these strategies during 2013/14

The estimated pupil premium grant for the school in 2013/14 is £6,300

The pupil premium grant is included in the school's budget plans and will be used to provide:

- Maintain TA support to deliver personalized intervention programmes
- Monies set aside initially to trade in specialist support
- Parental liaison worker to support families and meet parents/carers in the mornings before school alongside the Headteacher

Examples of impact in 2013/14 include:

- Parental liaison worker is available at the beginning of the day to greet pupils as they arrive, to assess their well being and to help children to be 'ready to work
- Parental liaison worker ensures an immediate point of contact before school for parents and carers to pass notes and messages on to class teachers
